NSW Government to fund council-run childcare centres

Today the NSW Government announced it has committed up to \$82 million to support 260 council-run childcare centres not eligible for JobKeeper payments.

This new funding will provide councils with certainty during this challenging time, ensuring childcare educators can be confident they will remain employed. Families and children can be assured that their preschool service will continue to operate.

The new funding also means community preschools and council childcare centres should remain open, unless they are closed on health advice.

The NSW Government strongly encourages, where possible, all councils to keep waste and recycling facilities open to the community. These services are an important service for the community.

Social distancing at council and committee meetings

Councils are reminded that a Circular is available to provide guidance on compliance with social distancing requirements at council meetings.

Councils are reminded that:

- Amendments have been made to the Act to temporarily modify the application of
 existing provisions of the Act and councils' codes of meeting practice. Any
 requirements under the Act or councils' codes of meeting practice for councillors
 to physically attend meetings and for members of the public to be permitted to
 attend meetings will be satisfied if attendance is by way of an audio-visual link.
 Councils are not required to make amendments to their codes of meeting practice
 to give effect to this.
- The amendment to the Act will operate for a period of six months but may be extended to 12 months.
- Where councillors participate in meetings remotely, they continue to be obliged to disclose and appropriately manage any pecuniary and/or non-pecuniary conflicts of interest they may have in matters being considered at meetings
- Where councillors participate in meetings remotely, they continue to be obliged to protect any confidential information considered at the meeting, and,
- Where meetings are closed to the public under section 10A of the Act, Councillors should ensure that they participate in the meeting in a location where it cannot be seen or heard by anyone else
