Gyms to reopen and kids' sport to return

Gyms, indoor pools, and yoga and dance studios can reopen within a fortnight and kids' sport can resume across NSW from 1 July, as more COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.

From 13 June, the following will be allowed:



- Gyms, and fitness, pilates, yoga and dance studios can reopen with up to 10 people per class and 100 people in an indoor venue
- Community centres, including their recreational facilities can reopen
- Some indoor recreational facilities including pools and saunas can also reopen with restricted numbers, and,
- Tattoo and massage parlours can reopen with up to 10 clients

The four-square metre rule must be applied at all times.

Community sport competitions will be able to restart for those aged 18 years and under from 1 July.
