### New Public Health Order released

A remade <u>Public Health Order</u> easing a number of restrictions came into effect today, subject to strict social distancing rules.

From today, the new rules keeping the State COVIDSafe mean:



- The number of people allowed inside indoor venues will be determined by the 'one person per 4 square metre' rule, with no upper limit. This includes function centres. All activity must be seated only.
- Cultural and sporting events at outdoor venues with a maximum capacity of 40,000 will be allowed up to 25 percent of their normal capacity. Events must be ticketed and seated and follow strict guidelines.
- On compassionate grounds, restrictions on funerals will immediately be eased to allow the four-square-metre rule to apply.

• All other restrictions including 20 guests inside the home and 20 for outside gatherings remain the same.

The <u>four-square-metre rule</u> must be applied at all times, along with completion of COVIDSafe plans.

# Supporting local businesses comply with COVID-19 restrictions

As COVID-19 restrictions ease and the focus moves towards recovery, the NSW Government is requesting councils support local businesses as they resume trading by assisting business operators

towards compliance with the Public Health Orders.

Requirements include mandatory COVIDSafe Plans for most businesses, which help bring more people back to work and are being accessed by thousands of businesses across NSW.

To facilitate economic recovery the Government has developed the COVIDSafe Check app, which allows customers to give feedback in real time to businesses, and regulators for action where necessary.

In some cases, feedback about businesses that may not be fully complying with the Public Health Orders may be provided to councils through the Office of Local Government (OLG).

Councils are asked to build on their community safety role by engaging with identified local businesses and guide owners and operators of the businesses to fulfil their obligations under the latest Public Health Order.

All enforcement action will remain a matter for the NSW Police Force.

# \$1 billion to unlock thousands of infrastructure jobs in NSW

The Commonwealth and NSW governments have partnered to invest more than \$1 billion in infrastructure projects and road safety upgrades across the State.



The funding package includes \$382 million to help local councils upgrade roads across regional NSW, which will directly and indirectly support an estimated 3,500 jobs.

This investment will turbocharge the NSW Government's <u>Fixing Local Roads</u> <u>program</u> to repair, maintain, or seal priority council roads, as well as enable projects to start construction over the next 12 months.

The first round of jointly funded projects will deliver more than 258 projects across 83 local government areas.

Additional NSW funding is sourced from the \$3 billion Project Acceleration Fund implemented through the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

### Showgrounds get further \$10.77 million cash injection

Hundreds more shovel-ready projects to repair and renew showgrounds across the State will be supported with an additional \$10.77 million in funding from the NSW Government.

The extra funding is supporting a further 129 projects at 71 showgrounds as part of the Government's COVID-19 Stimulus Package.

Last month the NSW Government allocated \$12.5 million to support 393 projects at 137 showgrounds across the State.

A further \$12.5 million will be allocated to more showground upgrade projects next financial year, bringing total spending to \$35.77 million.
