COVID-19 restrictions to be tightened across NSW

The NSW Government will tighten COVID-19 restrictions around "higher risk" indoor activities as the pandemic enters a new phase of community transmission.



From 12:01am next Friday (July 24) the following rules will be in force in NSW:

 Compliance measures <u>previously in place for pubs</u> will be extended to restaurants, bars, cafés, and clubs. This includes limiting group bookings to a maximum of 10 people; mandatory COVID-Safe plans and registration as a COVID-Safe business; and a digital record must be created within 24 hours.

- Weddings and corporate events will be limited to 150 people subject the four square metre rule and registration as a COVID-Safe busines Strict COVID-Safe plans must be in place and high-risk activities including singing and dancing must not occur, and
- Funerals and places of worship will be limited to 100 people, subject the one person per four square metre rule and a COVID-Safe busine registration.

The rules on gatherings remain the same, with up to 20 guests inside the home and 20 people for gatherings in a public place. However, as the home a high transmission area, the NSW Chief Health Officer **strongly recommends** a COVID-Safe precautionary approach of limiting visitors to thome to 10 people as a general principle.

Council officers, NSW Police, Liquor & Gaming inspectors and NSW Health officials are carrying out inspections across the State to ensure COVID-Safe plans are being followed. Fines and penalties apply.

OLG sits on the State Emergency Operations Centre (SEOC) and has a dir relationship with each of the key agencies involved in this work. OLG has received positive feedback from these agencies about this way of operating and how it ensures coordinated information and quick, accurate, a relevant responses to questions from the sector.
