Roundtable on community impact of NSW-Victoria border closure

Minister for Local Government Shelley Hancock and the Office of Local Government (OLG) today held a virtual roundtable with mayors and general managers from 13 councils on or near the NSW-Victoria border.



The online roundtable heard first-hand from local councils about the issues and challenges facing border communities from the current Public Health Orders and temporary closure of the NSW-Victoria border.

Councils were also given updates from senior representatives of the NSW Police Force and NSW Health as well as Cross-Border Commissioner James McTavish.

The Minister will escalate these concerns to senior levels of Government to help develop solutions where possible.

The Office of Local Government will continue to work with border councils and Commissioner McTavish to address community impacts.



Updates to border permits

A range of important changes to <u>border</u> <u>permits</u> have been implemented that further restrict entry to NSW and to Victoria by NSW residents.

The changes include:

- The list of critical services not available in NSW that provide an exemption for residents outside border communities
- · Persons entering on compassionate grounds, and
- NSW residents who attend boarding schools outside NSW.

Latest Health advice on wearing face masks

Councils are reminded of the latest advice issued by NSW Chief Health Officer Dr Kerry Chant regarding the wearing of masks.

Dr Chant recommends wearing a mask in the following circumstances:



- If it is hard to maintain 1.5 metres of physical distance from others in areas where there has been community transmission
- When in high-risk indoor areas such as public transport, supermarkets, shops, churches and other places of worship
- When caring for or serving vulnerable people, and
- If working in a cafe, restaurant, pub, club or other high-risk indoor areas.

While wearing a mask in any of these settings is not currently mandatory, it is highly recommended.

Contact tracing for NSW libraries

Under the current Public Health Order and <u>library COVID-19 Safety Plan</u> it is voluntary for people to leave their contact details when visiting a library.



NSW Health has now advised that it

is strongly recommended that people leave contact details with time and date of entry when visiting a library, ahead of expected changes to the Public Health Order in the coming days.
