

New Public Health Order for NSW-Victoria border

A new Public Health Order has been issued concerning the NSW-Victoria border.

From 12.01am today, (September 4) a single border region will be



reinstated. A map of the region and an address check can be found here.

All residents of the border region, including critical service workers and residents in remote communities, can <u>apply for a new border region</u> <u>permit</u>.

The border region resident permit allows a Victorian border region resident to enter NSW:

- To get necessary goods or services
- For care or other compassionate reasons

- To attend work or education (where it is not possible to do from home), and
- To permanently move to NSW.

A NSW border region resident can use the permit to enter Victoria for the same reasons and then return home to NSW.

If you have a border zone resident permit or a critical service – border region permit that is current at 12.01am today (September 4) it will:

- Be considered a new border region resident permit, with the new conditions, and
- Continue to be valid until the permit's date of expiry.

NSW Health to use 'area for increased testing'

NSW Health has introduced the term 'area for increased testing'.

This is an area or suburbs identified for increased testing because an infectious person lives or has visited there, or there has been

community transmission of COVID-19. Some people with COVID-19 may have only mild symptoms, so as much testing as possible is needed to ensure there's no hidden community transmission.

Some areas and suburbs may stay on the areas for increased testing list for several weeks after an infectious person has visited. NSW Health reviews these areas and suburbs regularly.
