Restrictions for outdoor dining and outdoor music performances eased

Restrictions at hospitality venues will be eased from this Friday to allow one patron for every two square metres in outdoor areas (previously this was one person per four square metres).

Businesses wishing to take advantage of the relaxed restrictions must use electronic



methods, such as QR codes, to record and keep contact details.

The Minister has signed an exemption to the Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 5) 2020 to allow an outdoor gathering of up to 500 people for the purpose of musical rehearsals and performances, subject to the following conditions:

• There must be a nominated organisation for each musical rehearsal or performance

- The nominated organiser must develop and comply with a COVID-19 safety plan that addresses the matters in the COVID-19 checklist, *Outdoor musical rehearsals and performances*
- Each person participating must provide their name and contact details to the nominated organiser and take reasonably practical steps to comply with the COVID-19 safety plan.

Southern Border Small Business Support Grant deadline extended

The Southern Border Small Business Support Grant program has been extended for eligible small businesses operating in the 13 impacted Local Government Areas.

The program is designed to help cushion the effects of the border restrictions on eligible NSW small businesses. More than 1,000 businesses have successfully applied for the grants.

The extension will also allow businesses to apply who are located within the LGAs but have an ABN registered at another address.

The Southern Border Small Business Support Grant program opened on September 8, with applications now able to be submitted until October 31. The expanded criteria will take effect from today.

The grant can only be used for eligible expenses incurred following the closure of the NSW-Victoria border on July 8 for which no other government support is available.
