## Commission Chair Bob Sendt said

"the Commission acknowledges concerns the community may have about this process being undertaken for a second time in 18 months. However, this is a new proposal submitted by Council, and the Commission must undertake its examination in accordance with the Local Government Act."

Mr Sendt said the Commission is required to consider the views of residents and ratepayers and it encourages interested parties to express their views on the new proposal at the public inquiry or via a written submission.

## Call for written submissions

The Commission has also called for written submissions from the local community in relation to the de-amalgamation business case.

Mr Sendt said

"I encourage anyone with an interest in this matter to make a written submission which the Commission will consider in examining the proposal."

Mr Sendt added that "The Commission cannot automatically carry forward previous submissions in examining the current proposal. However if a member of the public wants the Commission to take their earlier submission into account, they can write to the Commission requesting this."
