The Ray Hadley Morning Show - Interview between Ray Hadley
and Councillor Ian Scandrett

Thursday, 30 January 2020 at 10.49am

1 RAY HADLEY: I have been in correspondence with
2 Wingecarribee Council. Their Mayor appeared on breakfast
3 radio here on our network, Nine Network last week and said
4 some quite bizarre things about this waiving of the \$10,000
5 DA application for people who have lost their homes in that
6 shire to fires. So last night we get to a council meeting
7 where one of the councillors, and that is councillor for
8 Wingecarribee Shire Council Ian Scandrett, put a motion to
9 waive the DA. He was unsuccessful, 6/3 they have voted
10 against it. He is on the line. Councillor, good morning.

11
12 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Good morning, Ray.

13
14 RAY HADLEY: I watched part of what happened last night
15 and I have seen the Channel 7 report by Chris Maher. It
16 appeared to me those in gallery were people impacted who
17 lost their homes or representing those who had and they
18 were incensed by their treatment from the Mayor and by the
19 Council generally?

20
21 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: It was insensitive to say the
22 least. There were people who have lost their homes. There
23 were a lot of people who are very active in the community
24 who were appalled at our Mayor, as am I. I continue to be.
25 I called out "shame" when I was speaking. But Ray, where
26 do we go with this? I think I am going to have to call
27 a public meeting. I have had a lot of people speaking with
28 me this morning and they are saying get a public meeting
29 up.

30
31 RAY HADLEY: Well, you would know more about this than me.
32 Surely there can be intervention from the Local Government
33 Minter. If a council is behaving poorly by majority,
34 surely the Local Government Minter Shelley Hancock can
35 intervene here and say, well hang on a sec, you people need
36 to have a good long look at yourselves. We are in a
37 terrible situation.

38
39 You make the point in an email to me you have got
40 182 million in cash reserves including S94 levies
41 allocated, you have got 20 million that is unincumbent of
42 that 182 million and we are talking about 600,000, you are
43 talking about 10,000 times 60. And if the government pays
44 it later and reimburses the council, well and good, but in
45 the meantime you are able to move forward if you are
46 a person who has lost your home in your shire.

1 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Ray, we are a compassionate, caring
2 community and we are not acting like that. Our Mayor is
3 not doing that. I have to say to you that that should have
4 been the first thing that was done last night, spend that
5 from the reserves. The motion failed, the councillors are
6 not listen to the community. In fact, the Mayor's speech
7 did not recognise those people in the room at the top of
8 his mayoral minute. But let me say, on my Facebook I have
9 said, yes the best fix would be to sack us all - all.

10
11 RAY HADLEY: Get rid of the lot. So you are prepared to
12 the sacked by the Local Government Minister?

13
14 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Absolutely.

15
16 RAY HADLEY: So that they can put an administrator in to
17 do the right thing?

18
19 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Absolutely Ray. The best way to
20 get rid of the gene pool, start over.

21
22 RAY HADLEY: Okay. Now, you voted of course with your own
23 motion, who voted with you?

24
25 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: There were three of us who voted
26 with that motion and that was Councillor Turland and
27 Councillor Halstead. We wanted that money taken straight
28 from the reserves and applied, about 600,000 if they are
29 all about 10,000 in fees.

30
31 RAY HADLEY: Okay. All right, well let me go through the
32 councillors who voted the other way. So it is Councillor
33 Halstead, Deputy Mayor Councillor Turland he voted were
34 you; correct?

35
36 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Yes, with us, yes.

37
38 RAY HADLEY: Okay. And then you, Councillor Scandrett.
39 So that means the Mayor, Councillor Gair voted against you
40 in a --

41
42 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Yes. And tried to shut me down Ray
43 when the wanted suspension standing orders so that people
44 in the gallery could ask questions.

45
46 RAY HADLEY: Okay.

47

1 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: And he shut me down.
2
3 RAY HADLEY: Okay. Councillor Grahame Andrews voted with
4 the Mayor to dud the people of Wingecarribee who have lost
5 their homes. Councillor Graham McLachlan voted with the
6 Mayor to dud the people of Wingecarribee, Councillor --
7
8 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Local ALP councillor, yes, not very
9 impressive.
10
11 RAY HADLEY: So what - what preference is Councillor Gair?
12 Where does he swing, Labor, Liberal or in the middle?
13
14 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: He is an old National, had stood
15 for federal.
16
17 RAY HADLEY: He is an old National?
18
19 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Yes. And Grahame Andrews is very
20 close to him as is Peter --
21
22 RAY HADLEY: Okay.
23
24 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: -- Nelson you were about to read
25 out.
26
27 RAY HADLEY: Okay. What about the Councillor Gordon
28 Markwart, what is he?
29
30 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Our local Green.
31
32 RAY HADLEY: Oh, of course he would be, your local green.
33 Okay, everyone has got one of them. Councillor Nelson?
34
35 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: A former staff member and beholden
36 he ran to number 2 with Gair.
37
38 RAY HADLEY: So are you telling me that the National Party
39 of orchestrating this by --
40
41 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: No, I am not saying that Ray but
42 there are those connections.
43
44 RAY HADLEY: Well, yeah, well I will say it for you then,
45 okay. John Barilaro, the National's leader and Deputy
46 Premier, you need to put a rocket up the Nationals because
47 their voting as a block to stop the poor people in the

1 Wingecarribee Shire who lost their homes, 60 of them, to
2 waive the \$10,000 DA, I can't believe it. And what about
3 Councillor Larry Whipper, where did Larry go?
4

5 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Well Councillor Whipper is a half
6 a Green and he was --
7

8 RAY HADLEY: (Laughing).
9

10 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Despite saying he is very much
11 looking after the community, compassionate, works in the
12 industry, caring and so on, he voted against it.
13

14 RAY HADLEY: Okay.
15

16 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: It is unreal, unreal.
17

18 RAY HADLEY: It is. All right, well thank you for your
19 time Councillor and, if you need to be sacked, you will be
20 sacked. Thanks very much.
21

22 COUNCILLOR SCANDRETT: Thank you, Ray.
23

24 RAY HADLEY: All the best. So he wants to fall on his
25 sword Ian Scandrett. He said sack the lot of us, clean out
26 the gene pool.
27

28 But here we have John Barilaro - get me that opinion
29 piece he has written today - get me that opinion piece he
30 has written today, John Barilaro. He has written an
31 opinion piece - and I like him John Deputy Premier - good
32 fellow, commonsense sort of bloke. But here is a National
33 lead, a National lead council, according to one of the
34 councillors - Councillor Gair - Duncan Gair; the Mayor,
35 Councillor Grahame Andrews; Councillor Graham McLaughlin,
36 Councillor Gordon Markwart; who is a green; Councillor
37 Peter Nelson, who tends to be a National and then a half
38 Green, according to Ian Scandrett, Councillor Whipper. But
39 you have got National councillors voting against a motion
40 to waive the DA charges at 10,000 a head for 60 poor
41 buggers who lost their home.
42

43 And they wanted to come up with some concoction about,
44 oh well if you have got insurance, if you have got
45 insurance well, you know, they should pay the \$10,000 not
46 you so it doesn't matter so it is only the people who are
47 uninsured and we don't care about people who are uninsured.

2 But one of the things - and by the way the local MP
3 was there observing, Nathaniel Smith. His father is
4 a former Minister of the Crown and a former
5 Attorney-General in New South Wales. This Mayor doesn't
6 represent me says Ian. The community say the same. He has
7 been on council for 25 years and until two years ago, one
8 year as Mayor and now three years, same block voters last
9 night. They block - so they vote as a block.

10
11 Now this is what John Barilaro wrote today:

12
13 *How dare you, this is all wrong. I*
14 *shouldn't have to write this, I should be*
15 *back in my community on the other side of*
16 *the mountains. Yet you all come to the*
17 *regions for hope. You have stolen our*
18 *dreams, our children's future and your*
19 *empty words. People are suffering, people*
20 *are dying, entire regional communities are*
21 *collapsing and this could be the beginning*
22 *of a mass extinction of regional New South*
23 *Wales and all you can talk about is climate*
24 *change and the fairy tails of rolling hills*
25 *littered with wind turbines. How dare you?*
26 *So many great people across the globe like*
27 *Greta Thunberg ...*

28
29 By the way someone said "Why haven't you mentioned the fact
30 that she wants to trademark her name?" Because I don't
31 talk about her. I don't care about her. She is
32 a 15-year-old girl and she is irrelevant, as far as I am
33 concerned. Anyway, I love a lot of 15-year-old girls that
34 I know and they are very intelligent young women and they
35 are fantastic, but how she got on the world stage, I am
36 bugged if I know. I am absolutely flummoxed. Anyway:

38 *All those that live in the comfort of*
39 *eastern suburbs of Sydney, even my own*
40 *colleague Matt Kean want to make the summer*
41 *fires into a platform about climate change.*
42 *The reality is ideology has set our regions*
43 *up to fail. It is the regions who every*
44 *day have to deal with and live next to*
45 *national parks that are loaded up with fuel*
46 *loads ready to explode while tonnes of*
47 *bitumen, concrete and towers line the*

1 *suburbs of Sydney. It is the regions that*
2 *get littered with solar farms, wind*
3 *turbines let you refuse to let them on your*
4 *coastline of Sydney. It is the regions*
5 *that take Sydney's garbage every night*
6 *because God forbid you won't deal with your*
7 *own rubbish including your environmentally*
8 *damaging plastic. But we accept it, we do*
9 *our bit.*

10
11 And so he goes on. Well, all true. I don't disagree with
12 anything you have written John, all true. But you have got
13 bigger fish to fry John Barilaro and that is getting a fair
14 deal - and you are the man at the head of this. The
15 Premier has appointed you to look after those people
16 impacted by fires. Get on the phone to these dolts, your
17 colleagues who are Nationals - Nationals conservative
18 politicians at Wingecarribee Shire Council, and if they
19 vote as a block and there are three of them at least, the
20 vote would have been 6/3 the other way to waive it. Pick
21 up the phone John, ring them and say what the bloody hell
22 is going on at Wingecarribee? Why are you doing this to
23 me? I am writing opinion pieces today in the Daily
24 Telegraph, you know, to set us aside from our Sydney
25 cousins who don't care about us and here you are snubbing
26 60 of your constituents who lost their homes in dreadful
27 fires over the Christmas new year period. That is what you
28 should be doing Deputy Premier today, pulling these jerks
29 into line.
