Afternoons with Deborah Knight - Interview between Deborah Knight and Deputy Mayor Garry Turland

Thursday, 30 January 2020 at 1.27pm

DEBORAH KNIGHT: Now look we were talking before the news with John Barilaro from New South Wales - the deputy leader there about the issue of this council, the Wingecarribee Council in the Southern Highlands that has voted down the idea of waiving council fees for people to rebuild, which is just appalling. A National Party Mayor is behind this who voted against waiving the development fees. On the line is the Deputy Mayor Garry Turland. What do you think about this, Garry?

COUNCILLOR TURLAND: Oh, good afternoon, Deborah. Look, it has been a - it has got a little bit out of control. Let's go back a little bit. The article that was in the Telegraph where the Mayor made a statement that DA fees should only be waived to people without insurance, was his statement, not mine and not the other councillors. It was never brought up, it is what he said. He still hasn't apologised to us, the councillors and the community for that statement. That is one section of it.

The second part of it is, we had a meeting with the Local Government Association yesterday, the President, Linda and she made it clear to us councillors that were there in Wollondilly that the Sydney councils have made an offer to help the people in the bush affected by the fire, all the other shires, that they will send down their town planners to work on behalf of our shire at no cost.

Now, what happened last night, and the motion that was put forward by Gair and the others that voted against my motion, it all started back from the letter that went in in the Telegraph, because Ken Halstead, a town planner and councillor who used to lecture at University of UTS, put councillors on notice that he was going to move this motion that we did last night.

DEBORAH KNIGHT: But why are they against waiving the fees though? I mean, it beggars belief?

 COUNCILLOR TURLAND: Well, what - I know, I can't believe it either. I have no idea. What I - what I don't understand is why the Mayor and the General Manager did not stand up last night and say that we have had such a generous offer from the Sydney councils at no cost to all the other councils that have been affected by the fire, to deal with the DAs.
