- Woollahra Municipal Council, Leo Kelly OAM Arts and Culture Award (Division B, Population 30,000-70,000)
- Penrith City Council, LGNSW Planning Awards (Division C, Population over 70,000)
- Yass Valley Council, NSW Youth Week Awards (Most Innovative Youth Week Program)
