2.1. Will the proposed amendments made in the consultation draft of the Model Meeting Code achieve the policy outcomes identified in the paper?

No.

The new ruling preventing councils from holding private councillor briefing sessions is patently ridiculous.

A Councillor briefing session is a useful way for Councillors to request further information on an issue. It is not (and must not be) a decision-making forum. However, it is (and should be) a place for Councillors to ask the 'silly' questions that they would not ask in a public forum. At this stage of the election cycle, new Councillors are asking for clarity on planning laws and other matters that they don't understand – this is useful and helps Council to conduct its business professionally in Council meetings. They won't say "but I don't understand this" in a briefing that is open to the public.

The only impact that this ruling will have is to force Councils to have a pre-meeting-briefing-meeting-briefing. That's Yes Minister territory.
