#### 2 Legislative context

These guidelines have been issued by the Chief Executive, under the delegated authority of the Director-General, Department of Premier and Cabinet, to specify conditions for approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation.

The Regulation sets out requirements for the care and management of companion animals.

Under clause 3(1) of the Regulation, a recognised breeder is defined as a person who is a member of:

- a) Royal New South Wales Canine Council Limited1; or
- b) NSW Cat Fanciers' Association Inc; or
- c) Waratah State Cat Alliance Inc; or
- d) any other body approved by the Director-General for the purposes of this definition by order published in the NSW Government Gazette.

Clause 17(1) of the Regulation specifies the registration fee payable for a dog or cat that is not desexed and that is kept by a recognised breeder for breeding purposes.

#### 3 Purpose of guidelines

These guidelines set out conditions for approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation, enabling members of the body to pay the registration fee for a dog or cat that is not desexed and that is kept for breeding purposes.

#### 4 Conditions for approval

An organisation applying for approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation must meet all of the conditions listed below.

#### 4.1 Status

The organisation must be one of the following:

- registered by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission as an Australian company; or
- registered by NSW Registry of Co-operatives & Associations, NSW Fair Trading, as an incorporated association.

#### 4.2 Profile

The organisation must:

- have been operating for a minimum of three years since registering as a company or an incorporated association;
- have current members that breed dogs and/or cats; and
- provide services to members, including, but not limited to, breeding related information (responsible breeding, the care and welfare of breeding animals and their offspring, breed standards and registries) and advocacy.

#### 4.3 Compliance with relevant state legislation

The organisation must require members to be familiar with, and to observe, relevant state legislation, including:

- Companion Animals Act 1998 and Companion Animals Regulation 2008; and
- Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979 and Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (General) Regulation 2006.

#### 4.4 Code of practice

The organisation must require members to operate in accordance with minimum enforceable standards for the care and management of breeding animals set out in the Animal Welfare Code of Practice – Breeding Dogs and Cats (the Code), recognised under Schedule 2 Animal trades and Codes of Practice of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (General) Regulation 2006, issued by Industry & Investment NSW.

An organisation may also require members to operate in accordance with non-enforceable guidelines for the care and management of breeding animals set out in the Code which reflect current accepted best practice and generally afford higher levels of care and management (except where the standard itself is recognised as best practice).

The organisation is responsible for ensuring that members operate in accordance with the Code.

#### 5 Limitations on use of approval

Approval by the Chief Executive of an organisation as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation does not imply endorsement of the body. The approval may not be used to promote the body or to verify its credentials or those of its members. An approval under clause 3(1) of the Regulation is to be used solely for the purpose for which it has been granted.

#### 6 Possible consequences of non-compliance

Failure to comply with any of the conditions for approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation may result in withdrawal of the approval.

If it is decided to withdraw the approval because of evidence of a breach of one or more of the approval conditions, the Chief Executive will notify the organisation in writing, informing it of the reason/s for the decision.

#### 7 Application process

# 7.1 Applying for approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Companion Animals Regulation 2008

An organisation seeking approval as a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation must complete and return an Application for Approval as a Recognised Breeder Body under Clause 3(1) of the Companion Animals Regulation 2008 form (Appendix A), attaching evidence of compliance with conditions for approval outlined in these guidelines, to: Chief Executive, Division of Local Government, Department of Premier and Cabinet. #### 7.2 Notifying applicants of the outcome of their application

Applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their application.

Approvals will be issued as an Order published in the NSW Government Gazette.

#### 7.3 Handling of information provided in the application

Information provided in an organisation's application will be handled in accordance with the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998*.

It will not be disclosed to third parties, except as required for the processing of the application, that is, the publication of an Order in the Gazette or in accordance with the Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009.

#### 7.4 Duration of approval

The approval is valid for five years from date of publication in the Gazette. The Division will notify an organisation holding an approval of the need to re-apply within three months of the expiry date of the approval. If the organisation does not re-apply within the prescribed timeframe, the approval will automatically lapse.

# 7.5 Requirement to notify the Division of any change to information provided in the application

An organisation that has applied for, or been granted approval as, a recognised breeder body under clause 3(1) of the Regulation is required to notify the Division of Local Government of any change/s to information provided in the original application within 14 days. Failure to notify the Division of any change/s within the prescribed timeframe may invalidate the application or approval.

Approval as Recognised Breeder Body Guidelines

Information to be presented by a member of a recognised breeder

body on registering a breeding dog or cat

When a breeder member of a recognised breeder body registers a breeding dog or cat, a

council officer must sight:

1. proof of current membership as a breeder member of a recognised breeder body

defined under clause 3(1) of the Regulation;

2. documentation verifying that the cat or dog is of a breed accepted by the

recognised breeder body; and

3. a signed statement by the member that the cat or dog is to be kept for breeding

purposes.

If the required documentation is not produced, a council officer cannot process the

registration at the recognised breeder registration rate. A current list of recognised breeder

bodies will be available on the Division's website.
